Invite, bring and sit with a special someone you know in their 20's or 30's


What I ask of you is not easy. Ushering in change is never easy. But it is possible.

Mental Illness Spiritual Support – God is our Refuge and our Strength

WE RECOGNIZE THAT MENTAL ILLNESS ARE MEDICAL ILLNESSES THAT MAY HAVE ENVIRONMENTAL TRIGGERS - "I will be glad and rejoice in your love for you saw my affliction and knew the anguish of my soul."
Psalm 31:7

Mental illness is not simply aggression or strange actions that a person chooses. Like every other disease, there is a physical component. The affected organ is the brain. Something is wrong in the brain to cause symptoms that manifest themselves in behavior changes or mood swings. The changes are not anything the person can control any more than they can control symptoms of other diseases, such as pain, weakness, trembling, or debility. Like other diseases, medicine is used to restore a proper balance and reduce symptoms, allowing proper functioning. People who have mental illness need as much medical help as a person with more observable physical problems. Someone must do what the person cannot do himself to get appropriate treatment. With a disorder of the mind it is just as impossible to organize thoughts to obtain help as it is to walk with a broken leg.

Letter from Rev. Kathy Rice

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the summer of 2013 there were some decisions made regarding opportunities for how we care for one another. Each congregation has many more needs than one pastor can deal with alone. Some are long-term needs and some are only crisis needs.

Dr. Johnson and I looked at a couple of different caring ministries and decided on Stephen Ministries (Caregivers) for this congregation. I went to the Leadership Training Program in Pittsburg, PA, that summer and came back with much enthusiasm and hope for an active ministry at St. Paul.

In the first training class there were four members who were trained and commissioned. The current training class is happening with Northwest Hills Church and there are four participants with one of them being from St. Paul.

Stephen caregivers have been assigned to care for six persons since we began. Some relationships have been longer than others. Many persons I have asked, however, have declined the opportunity. Each of us has different gifts and different needs. This is one way in which those gifts and needs can be shared for good.

Since we began in August, 2013, I have been the leader of the Stephen Ministry program. This has been a paid position at half-time, 20 hours per week. I have been very grateful and blessed by this gift. In the life of this church, however, it is time for a change. As of December 31, 2016, the Stephen Leader position will no longer be a paid position. I plan to continue in some way with the program but not as much as I have for the last 3 years. Our budget situation dictates that some items need to be cut from the budget. This position is one of those items.

Each of us makes decisions based on differing information and circumstances. I find that I am ready to be fully retired...finally. I look forward to different challenges and opportunities in my life and the life of this congregation.

Thank you for the challenge and the opportunity.


