## Stephen Caregivers

New things are happening in the Stephen Caregivers ministry. We now meet monthly for continuing education and support of one another. Kathy Rice has been in conversation with a Stephen Leader from Westhills Church (United Church of Christ) to begin our next training for new caregivers on August 24<sup>th</sup>. Summer will be ended and school will have begun. This will enable us to have more people and to share more experiences in the training. In Omaha we have a Stephen Leaders group that meets quarterly. There are some in that group who have indicated an interest in coming together with us.



Remember, all Stephen relationships are kept confidential. Sometimes even the pastor does not know who has a Stephen caregiver already. The only records kept are the numbers of people and the duration of the relationship. At the end of the relationship and notes or records are shredded so your privacy is protected. ## Helping with Youth Outreach via Tzadakahs

Tzadakah is a Hebrew word that means *justice* or *righteousness*. It refers to the religious obligation to do what is right and just, which are considered important parts of living a spiritual life.

We will join 92 other churches that have used Tzadakahs. During the week of May 9<sup>th</sup>, the giving boxes will be placed in each worship area in order to have a designated place to regularly give to Youth Emergency Services. Among items to consider giving are food (especially protein bars, jerky, cheese sticks, nuts, small cans of fruit, water, peanut butter crackers), baby wipes, \$5-\$10 vouchers for Walgreens or CVS, clean socks and underwear, diapers, feminine hygiene products, toothpaste and toothbrushes, bus tickets, blankets, and deodorant.

Saint Paul Youth **thank you** for remembering homeless teens in the Omaha metro area by bringing needed items to fill the Tzadakahs.
