#### **November Communal Offering**

An important element in the receiving of Christ's holy meal is how we respond to the invitation. Through our monthly communal offering we respond to being the body of Christ in a truly tangible way. On November 01/02 our second mile giving will help support the denominational special offering for the **Ministerial Education Fund**. The sacramental observance on this weekend reminds us of the church's affirmation that we continue to share the responsibility for education of our clergy. It is one of the seven apportioned funds that enables United Methodists to do together what no church, district, or annual conference could do alone.

Through the MEF and other funds, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work. All of our 13 seminaries make scholarships available to qualified United Methodist students. These funds are in addition to money students receive from annual conference MEF dollars.

Twenty-five percent of MEF apportioned dollars are retained in annual conferences, preparing candidates for ministry, to support continuing education for pastors and clergy recruitment and to provide financial aid for students. The MEF is at the heart of preparing people for making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.


